Effective December 21, 2020: The Fairfax County Health Department consolidated services across its five district offices to one location. Clients in need of essential services offered by the health department can make an appointment at the Joseph Willard Health Center, 3750 Old Lee Highway Fairfax, VA, 22030-1806

Hours of Operation - Mon, Tu,Th 8 am – 4:30 pm, W 8 am – 6 pm, Friday 7:30 am – 4:30pm

Essential services are ongoing but with specific limitations per service type. These limited services include immunizations, pregnancy tests, STI services, TB testing, yellow fever immunizations and WIC services. Services are by appointment only. To make an appointment, call 703-246-7100. Please note that the Health Department does not offer COVID-19 testing.

They provide comprehensive, community-based primary health care including dental. They have 10 clinics throughout Arlington, Alexandria, and Fairfax Counties.

Neighborhood Health is able to assist those with financial need through our sliding fee scale program. Eligibility is based on family size and total family income. Cultural and language expertise, collaboration, and community support distinguish our services.

COVID-19 Testing: COVID-19 testing is available by appointment only for both existing and new patients. Existing patients, with or without symptoms, should call (703) 535-5568 to request a testing appointment. New patients should call (703) 535-5568 to make an appointment for a telemedicine visit and request a testing appointment. Please do not come for testing without an appointment. COVID-19 testing is free for uninsured patients.

ICCW provides Prenatal and Gynecologic Care for Women Who Are Uninsured. The program is a service offered to the community in collaboration with the Fairfax County Health Department, serving uninsured and low-income patients up to 400% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPL).

The clinics provide comprehensive outpatient obstetrical services and gynecological care as well as non-stress testing, LEEP and colposcopy procedures at little to no cost to the patient. We also offer specialty gynecological care, including maternal fetal medicine, Gyn/Onc and Uro/Gyn services.

Additionally, ICCW provides support services including: radiology, laboratory, genetic testing, diabetes management, case management, social work, family planning and nutritional counseling.
